League of American Bicyclists, 2023 National Bike Summit in Washington DC



In March, several advocates, including advocates representing Families For Safe Streets, trekked to Washington to be the voice of the nation's 57 million bicyclists, promoting and protecting their right to ride. I was one of five grateful advocates selected from my state of Florida to attend the Summit. We went to the Capitol to share our voices to make biking safer and more convenient with fewer 'Bike Lane Ends' signs and more protected places for individuals, families, and community members to ride.

Testifying in Tallahassee

I travelled to Tallahassee during the legislative session to testify in favor of SB 766 and HB 657, and, thankfully, both bills were ultimately signed and passed into law. Florida School districts now have the authorization to place and control cameras on the exteriors of buses to document drivers who illegally drive past the bus while it's displaying a stop sign. Likewise, counties or municipalities can now enforce speed limits in school zones through speed detection systems, and a portion of the fees collected from ticketed fines pays into the School

Regarding SB 766, last year, the Florida Department of Education conducted a survey of school-bus drivers and found widespread instances of vehicles illegally passing stopped buses. "The survey results from 2022 show that on a single day, 7,867 illegal passes were made based on the observations of 6,416 school bus drivers who completed the survey," a Senate staff analysis of SB 766 said.

School districts can now contract with companies to install cameras on school buses. Each camera will have to be capable of producing a recorded video and two or more still images documenting infractions. The law also will prevent the contractors from getting paid based on the numbers of violations detected.

What is Target Zero?



Target Zero is a statewide initiative to reduce the number of transportation-related serious injuries and deaths across Florida to ZERO.

Why does Florida need Target Zero?

On average, eight people are killed and 49 are seriously injured on Florida's roads every day. In the majority of those serious

and fatal crashes, driver behavior is a contributing factor. This initiative focuses on connecting, interacting, and designing our transportation system to specifically relate to those (drivers) that are most involved in crashes that resulted in serious injuries and fatalities.
