In honor of Mark, I invite you to Make Your Mark with a gift that helps grieving children feel seen, supported, and less alone.

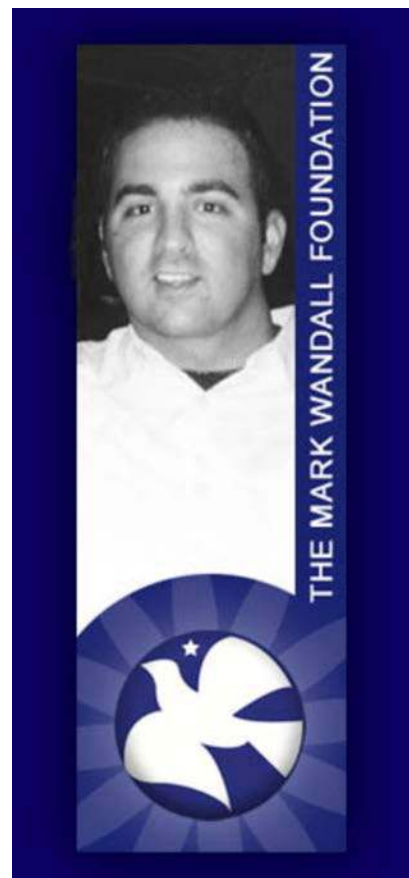
In Florida, one in every 10 children will experience the death of a parent or sibling before the age of 18. Grief can be isolating, especially for young people.

One of our most meaningful and most-loved programs continues to grow.

The Mark Wandall Foundation is proud to partner with SMART with HEART and Suncoast Therapeutic Equine Partners (STEP) to offer **two equine-assisted learning sessions each month**—providing children who have experienced the death of a parent, sibling, or guardian with a safe space to heal, connect, and rebuild confidence.

This **donor funded, 2-hour program** is open to children **ages 4 and older** and focuses on healing, bonding, and team-building through hands-on experiences with horses.

Program Locations & Schedule

- Second Saturday of each month: SMART with HEART (Bradenton)
- Last Saturday of each month: STEP (Sarasota)
- Sessions run from **9:30 AM–12:00 PM**, and spots are limited each month.

Registration Details

- Registration opens **mid-month prior to each session** and is announced exclusively through The Mark Wandall Foundation email list.
- Families may register for **one session per month**, with the option to join the standby list for the second session if space allows.

After registering, families will receive a confirmation email. Required participant paperwork is valid for the entire riding season.

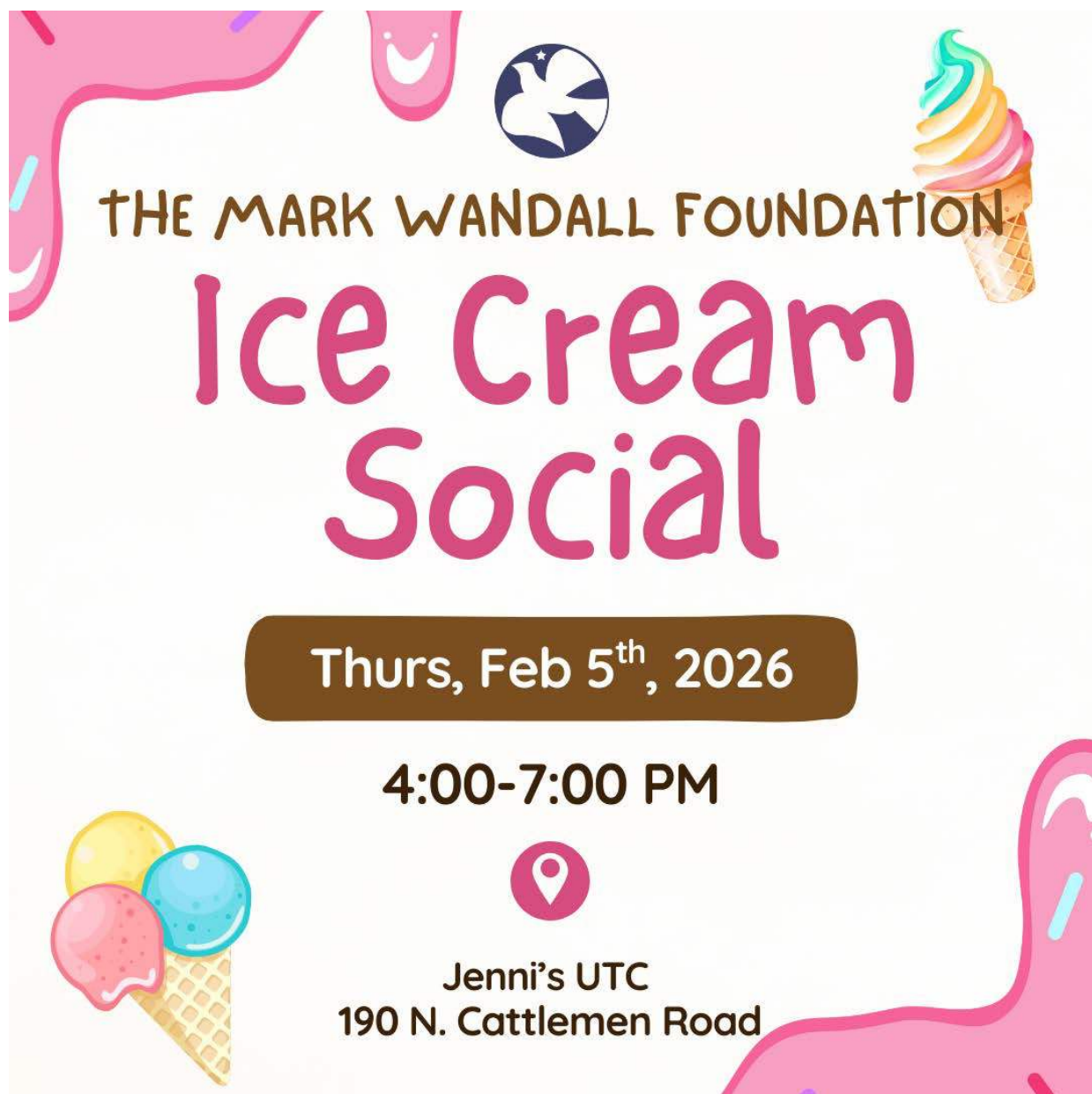

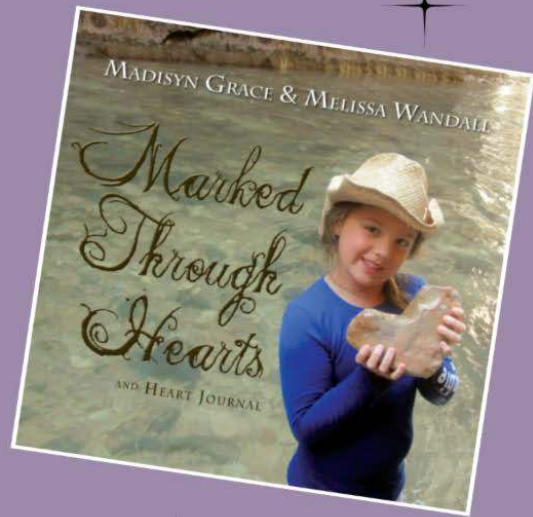
